Reimagining CHILDCARE RESEARCH STUDY

Through the generous support from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF), CEED is working with their Reimagining Child Care Portfolio grantees to share their initiative stories, as well as individual and collective impact on the childcare advocacy ecosystem. Through this opportunity, we will learn how grantees' actions of power building are advancing the narrative of caregivers and family childcare providers, as well as centering families and children who are racially and economically marginalized.

Outputs



Identify indicators of progress and success to inform RWJF's future work for their Healthy Children and Families focus area.



Develop grantee contribution stories that represent context, planning, accomplishments, and key learnings.



Create briefs highlighting key activities that led to successes, lessons learned, as well as an advocacy concept model for early childhood professionals and other key players.



Aim 1

Learn how each grantee contributed to the childcare advocacy ecosystem to determine individual and collective impact.

Aim 2

Determine, through indicators and process measures, what demonstrates successful impact beyond just a typical "policy win."

Aim 5

Identify how RWJF has changed the early care and education ecosystem through their funding of advocacy efforts.

Aim 4

Examine how collaboration, voice, power structures, and relationships can be used to determine measures of success.
